Abstract:

December 5, 2009

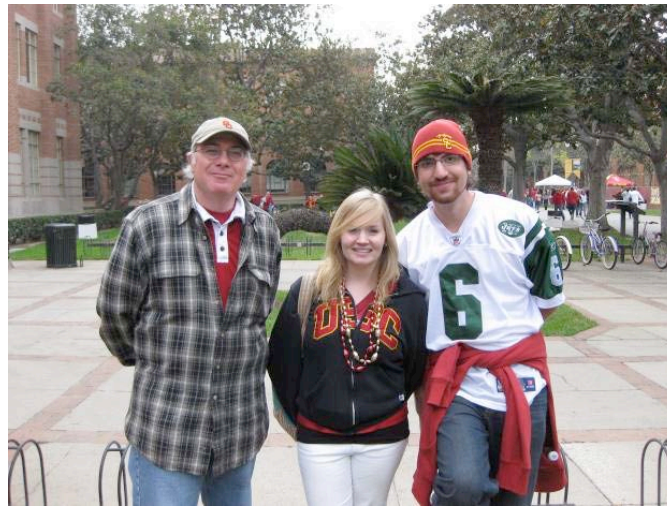

2010 SPE WRM - CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

The 2010 SPE Western Regional Meeting (WRM) will be held May 27-29, 2010 in conjunction with the AAPG Pacific Section & Cordilleran GSA in Anaheim California. The theme of the joint conference this year is "From Mountains to Main Street."

This conference will focus on technologies and issues affecting oil and gas fields in the Western North American Region. We desire presentations by engineers, geoscientists, managers, and team leaders that address improving operating costs and efficiency, new oil and gas technologies, and insights on regulatory and climate change legislation that affect energy supplies.

Technical papers are encouraged. To attract up-to-the-minute presentations, abstracts will also be accepted for poster sessions, panel sessions, and technical workshops that do not require papers. Conference sessions will be formulated based upon the abstracts submitted and accepted by the technical program committee.

Abstracts should be submitted to the program committee by January 10, 2010 that specify the type presentation, contain no more than 300 words, and summarize the subject matter, results of work, and conclusions in the topics listed below:

- Integrated Operations
- Locating By-Passed Oil
- Mature waterflood Management
- Production Enhancement
- Redevelopment of California Offshore Resources
- Renewable Energy to Cut OPEX
- Reservoir Characterization
- Social Responsibility, Health, Air and Water Quality and GHG Emissions
- Tight Plays: Monterey (Diatomites, fractured Siliceous Rocks), Bakken
- Waste Disposal

Program Committee Procedures: The paper proposal should contain significant new knowledge or experience in some field of relevance. The substance of the proposed paper must not have been published previously in trade journals or other professional or technical journals. Prior to paper proposal submission, clearance must be obtained. Any problems concerning clearance should be outlined when the paper proposal is submitted. All authors of papers presented at 2010 WRM will be required to complete and submit a copyright release form to SPE or submit the copyright exemption form where applicable.

Manuscript Preparation: Authors of papers selected for 2010 WRM will be notified by January 25, 2010. Authors offering papers should fully understand that a manuscript will be required for each accepted paper. Manuscripts will be required by March 29, 2010 for inclusion in the Proceedings CD-ROM. SPE operates a "no paper, no podium" policy which means that if the manuscript is not received by the due date then it will be withdrawn from the program. The maximum desired length of any paper is 7,000 words, including figures and tables. Detailed instructions on the preparation of manuscripts and presentations will be sent to the corresponding author of each accepted paper.

LASPE OFFERS FALL 2010 SCHOLARSHIPS! APPLY NOW

The Los Angeles Basin of the Society of Petroleum Engineers is now accepting applications for Scholarships for the 2010/2011 school year.

Local students who are classified as undergraduates and graduate students at the beginning of the 2010 fall semester attending may be eligible for these scholarships. There are four types of scholarships available through the section:

- Mei Chang Memorial Scholarship: \$500 awards are available for high school graduates entering college in the fall of their graduating year or following year. This scholarship is a tribute to Ms. Mei Chang, a Sr. Research Scientist with Chevron. She is remembered for her steady contributions to LASPE and for tutoring science and math high school students. The awards are available to children, grandchildren and siblings of LASPE members or local students sponsored by LASPE members in good standing (subject to board approval).
- Undergraduate Scholarships: \$500 scholarships are available for undergraduate college students pursuing petroleum engineering or geology, chemical, civil, mechanical, environmental or related engineering curriculums. The awards are available to active LASPE student members or SPE student members attending southern California colleges or universities.
- Graduate Scholarships: \$1,000 scholarships are available for college graduate students pursuing studies or conducting research in energy and petroleum related subjects. The awards are available to active LASPE student members or SPE student members attending southern California colleges or universities.
- Bruce Davis Memorial Scholarship: \$1,000 award is available for a USC student pursuing graduate studies in petroleum related fields, chemical engineering and chemistry. Dr. Davis, a 26-year employee of Chevron, considered himself an experimental chemist and wished to encourage students with science backgrounds to pursue a future career in the Petroleum Industry.

In addition to the above scholarships available through the section, the SPE Foundation annually awards the Gus Archie Memorial Scholarship, a four-year, \$6,000 annual grant to the outstanding college freshman pursuing an undergraduate degree in petroleum engineering. DECEMBER 8, 2009

1. The meeting was called to order at 11:00 AM

2. The meeting agenda was approved.

3. The minutes of the meeting of November 10 were approved.

4. There were no announcements.

5. Reports

a. Treasurer's Report: For the month of November, LASPE had \$3,492 in expenses, and only \$100 in income. This is not unexpected for this time of the budget year.

b. Golf Tournament: For the 2010 Tournament, the goal is to have 66 foursomes. In the difficult time of the 2009 Tournament, there were only 60 foursomes. Some previous years have had as many as 72 foursomes. The budget for the Golf Tournament is for \$50,000 in income (including the raffle and other activities, as well as golf) and \$35,000 in expenses.

c. Western Region: Dr. Sarem presented a list of WR nominees for SPE awards, and there was some discussion on the subject. Dr. Sarem explained the SPE awards process, and noted that some previous nominations have expired. The Board may choose to re-nominate some award candidates.

d. Student Chapters. A letter from Cal State Long Beach students who attended the ATCE in New Orleans was included in the November LASPE Newsletter.

6. Old Business

a. 2010 Western Region Meeting

The deadline for submitting abstracts of papers for the 2010 Western Region Meeting has been extended to January 10, 2010, but the deadline for final papers is unchanged at March 29, 2010.

Some other Western Region sections (Golden Gate, San Joaquin, Alaska) have agreed to subsidize the attendance of their members at a rate of \$50 per full-time registration. The smaller sections (Santa Maria, Ventura) have not committed to that policy.

Among the activities at the 2010 Western Region Meeting will be an Urban Oil Fields tour. It is planned to include a visit to the Brea field – a short distance from the meeting venue in Anaheim – at the start of the tour.

There will also be a THUMS tour, and there was some discussion of whether it will be possible to include a Huntington Beach tour.

Planning is underway for including Continuing Education courses with the 2010 Western Region Meeting. The plan is for up to 4 short courses to be scheduled on Wednesday afternoon (May 26th) before the start of the main meeting on Thursday. PTTC is available to provide 4 such short courses, but the topics need to be decided soon. Scott Hara will welcome input on what courses the LASPE membership wants and needs.

b. Young Professionals: A YP event was held as a Tailgate party at the USC-Arizona football game on December 5th. USC was a gracious host, and the event was considered a success – even though USC lost the game.

7. New Business

a. There was some discussion of the budgeted amount for the Young Professionals program, but no changes were made to the previously approved Budget.

b. It is planned to invite Legion of Honor (50-year) members to a future LASPE meeting to receive their plaques from SPE.

c. 2010 Engineer Week Awards. This was briefly discussed, and subsequent to the meeting Chairperson Perez sent an e-mail to Board members soliciting nominations for several possible awards from the Orange County Engineering Council, of which LASPE is a member.

d. Chairperson Perez noted that LASPE needs to fill the vacant position of Vice Chairperson. Normally, expectation is that the Vice Chair this year will become Chair in the following year. Volunteers will be welcomed.

8. The meeting was adjourned at 11:45 AM.

IN MEMORIAM

John F. Matthews, Jr.

Former Division of Oil and Gas Chief, John F. Matthews pass away on December 3, 2009 due to complications from a fall. John had just turned 84 and enjoyed a span of 59 years as a petroleum engineer. He never did retire and was still actively involved in projects.

He first started in a Roughneck position in the Kern County Oil Patch and eventually Beroid Oil. He joined the California Division of Oil and Gas in 1953, with stops in Hawthorne, Bakersfield and Inglewood. While in Inglewood, John returned to USC and obtained his Masters Degree in Petroleum Engineering. His career with the State culminated with his appointment in 1971 by then Governor, Ronald Reagan, as Chief of the Division of Oil and Gas in Sacramento. After Reagan's departure and a 23 year tenure with the Division, John left to become a professional consulting petroleum engineer where he was involved in numerous studies and projects on behalf of clients over the past 33 years.

John's extensive knowledge of older California oil and gas fields and the drilling practices and technologies historically utilized in them would serve as a living resource for himself and others regarding issues of subsidence, abandonment and reworking of older wells and fields. John always considered himself to be, first and foremost, a Reservoir Engineer. His specialization aided in the successful creation of several gas storage projects throughout the State.

His family wishes to thank his many friends, business associates and co-workers within the industry and with whom he shared his passion for petroleum engineering.
